Within a few minutes General Crook arrived with the rest of the division, and the defenders broke and ran. Cloyd's Mountain cost the Union army 688 casualties, while the rebels suffered 538 killed, wounded, and captured. Following the campaign, Crook was placed in command of a cavalry division in the Army of the Cumberland under General George H. Thomas, and commanded the division through the Battle of Chickamauga. In the spring of 1864, Crook was sent back to western Virginia and took part in General Ulysses S. Grant's spring campaign.
